BORDER CARE PROJECT NEWS

Cappy Davidson, chair Border Care Project (edited for the newsletter)

Over the last year and a half, SARW has supported Camino Real Republican Women's Club/Border Care Project, which was started by a former SARW club member Debbie Wall.

In 2019, Debbie Wall began to help our Texas Border Patrol men and women when she received a call from a Camino Real member from the city of Edinburg, Texas requesting hand sanitizer due to the caravans crossing the border carrying various kinds of diseases.



Her goal was to get as much as she could through donations. Success! She got four pickup trucks full! After further discussions, she realized they needed sunscreen, insect repellent, and hand wipes. Covid proved the need for disinfectants after losing agents.

Debbie continues to serve the Del Rio station as they distribute the first-aid bags and snacks to all of their field stations. She also supplies the Brackettville sheriff's office since he is the host for DPS and National Guard. Snacks are appreciated since they are in a remote area.

Over this past year, I have been fortunate when I was asked to accompany Debbie on several of her trips to the border. Debbie has built an important relationship of trust with the Border Patrol. She is given first-hand information from the officers regarding the smuggling of drugs and human trafficking situations. We have heard how this administration has abandoned the citizens of south Texas and their property rights. This administration seems to protect the rights of criminals, drug smugglers, human traffickers, rapists, and pedophiles.



Any support that our club and friends can give to The Border Care Project is greatly appreciated by Debbie and her officers. They need our support and well wishes. It is comforting for the officers to know that people appreciate what they are doing to protect the citizens of our country.



Hello fellow Republicans!

On May 6, San Antonio, we will be holding a city election to vote for Mayor and city council members. Also on the ballot is a very important Proposal amendment entitled the JUSTICE CHARTER nicknamed the Criminal Benefits Act. This 13 page document was written by an Austin based non-profit group founded by two radical attorneys. This is much more than a grass roots endeavor. It is a state wide, national progressive effort to undermine and demoralize our police officers and to dismantle our state's judicial system. This charter is written using misleading information and catch phrases that are meant to confuse voters and cover up their real intent.





One example of the way these activists have attempted to mislead voters is to demand to abolish no choke holds and no-knock warrants, which are already policies which exist and are being enforced. Another part of this proposal advocates that a thief can steal up to \$750 worth of your personal property or services and receive only a citation. Equally frightening, this Charter would create a new city position called the Justice Director who will have control over the hiring, firing, punishing and promotions of San Antonio police officers. In other words, our police officers would be working for the very people who want to weaken and eventually abolish them in favor of a liberal/leftist replacement.

If people want to see how a Justice Charter works, they should look at Austin, where they have such a city charter and crime is rampant. When you excuse, tolerate and reward bad behavior for any reason, including race and income, you have more and even worse behavior.

As law abiding citizens and businesses, we must speak up and oppose this charter amendment which will most definitely create more theft, assaults, and vandalism. We will begin to look more and more like San Francisco, Portland and Seattle.



DO NOT BE FOOLED! THIS IS THEIR LANGUAGE:

"A petition to amend the City Charter of San Antonio to adopt a justice policy that will reduce unnecessary arrests and save scarce public resources through a comprehensive set of reforms, including: ending enforcement of low-level marijuana possession; ending enforcement of abortion crimes; banning chokeholds; banning no-knock warrants; and encouraging citations instead of arrests for low-level nonviolent crimes."



Not one Democrat voted for the 14th or 15th Amendments!

The 13th Amendment abolished slavery, making all slaves free contributors to the country. The 14 Amendment granted citizenship to everyone born or naturalized in the United States therefore making all non-whites citizens. The 15th Amendment gave voting rights to all citizens including non-whites.

The 13th Amendment passed with 100% of the Republican vote and 21% of the Democratic vote. The 14 Amendment passed with 94% of Republicans voting for passage and 0% of Democrats. The 15th Amendment was passed by 100% of the Republican vote and 0% of the Democratic vote.

IMMIGRANT VISIT REFLECTION

A couple of weeks ago a few of us went to the Immigrant Center where we were given an overview of the facility and its daily operations. George Rodriguez and Bob Bishop shared their observations, personal experiences, future perspective.

The original owner, Paul Casey sold the building to FEMA in 2021 for the sum of four million dollars. FEMA followed this transaction by entering a contract with Catholic Charities for the purpose of administrating perceived required services for the newly arrived immigrants. The rental amount paid by Catholic Charities was reported to be \$130k per month.

The reported number of immigrants under the care of Catholic Charities is 700 to 1,000 individuals including minors. Each immigrant is given a cell phone. The purpose of the cell phone is to help US officials locate the immigrant in future processing. It also allows immigrants to communicate with family and possibly connect with family in the immediate area. If there are family members in the immediate area the immigrant is turned over to the family member.

Initially there was a 10 o'clock curfew which was dropped after administrators realized they had no control over the free-spirited individuals who had taken an unstructured journey. Immigrants live in an open environment with the area divided into two sections by gender. Each section is populated with cots and aluminum blankets for sleeping purposes. This facility is used by those immigrants deemed to be healthy. Those falling into the general category of illness are housed at the La Quinta Inn. The hotel continues to accept registered guest without disclosing the presence of the ill immigrants.

Immigrants have registered complaints! They informed Catholic Charities of their high opinion of the food provided by throwing the food into the dumpsters. They were generously given clothes which were also rejected in the same fashion. The solution was to give each immigrant a stipend. The exact amount was not provided but I understand that merchants in the area are complaining.

Crimes and prostitution to accommodate both genders were free flowing like a river formed by a great waterfall. It was reported that neighbors within walking distance occasionally had unwanted visitors. One single elderly female reported individuals repeatedly knocking on her door asking to enter her home and for food or other possessions. She is afraid to leave and live what would be a normal routine. With this knowledge and concerns for the safety of the neighbors more attempts were made to gain control of immigrant behaviors.

Immigrant length of stay limitations were imposed and attempts have been made to enforce the policy, however, some immigrants have remained beyond the three-day limitation.

We observed a few immigrants at work. One skilled with the ability to cut hair openly set up his outdoor shop and was very busy with his occupation. Others were pointed out and were providing lookout services. My only personal experience with one of the immigrants was having one of the lookouts call out to me when I unknowingly drove into the work area.


