We are going to Go Big on this fundraiser! It is our only fundraiser this year and we want to raise funds to support conservative candidates as we begin another campaign cycle.



In 1866 the Democrats formed the Ku Klux Klan to break the strength of the Republicans and gain control of the government. The Klan's objective was to destroy the Republican Party. Their attacks were aimed at Republicans regardless to race. Of the documented 4,743 lynchings 1,297 were of white Republicans and the primary reason was the party's effort to pass anti-lynching laws. "WallBuilders, 2020"

Democrats relied on the Klan to secure election victories, as Klansmen oftentimes threatened or killed competing Republican candidates. Many southern Republicans actually abandoned their campaigns due to the inability to hold meetings and attract voters while living in constant fear. One such event was the 1868 Mississippi attack on blacks and Republican officials trying to vote on the state's new constitution. The attack was led by the former governor, William Sharkey.

Republicans lost hold within the South largely due to Klan violence, allowing the South to maintain a ruling racial order that morphed into Jim Crow. The black population overwhelmed the white population. Blacks voted Republican therefore to get and hold control of the nation led to finding means to control the black population.

In response, in 1870 and 1871, the Reconstructionist Congress passed a series of Enforcement Acts in (also known as the Force Acts) to curb such violence and empower the president to use military force to protect the rights of African Americans.

The Third Force Act, also known as the KKK or the Civil Rights Act of 1871, empowered President Ulysses S. Grant to use the armed forces to combat those who conspired to deny equal protection of the laws and, if necessary, to suspend habeas corpus to enforce the act. Grant signed the legislation on this day in 1871. After the act's passage, the president for the first time had the power to suppress state disorders on his own initiative and suspend the right of habeas corpus. Grant did not hesitate to use this authority.
