Texas Constitution Amendments To be voted on Nov 7, 2023



Proposition 1- HJR 126

Vote "NO" AGAINST. This is a wolf in sheep's clothing. It appears to affirm the "rights" of individuals but it actually affirms the right of bureaucracy to establish laws and regulations that may abridge your rights of ownership and use.

PROPOSITION 2- SJR 64

- Shifts Tax burden to property owners.
- Gives preferential treatment regardless of the level of care for children.
- does not address the real problems of the child-care system, such as quality, affordability, and accessibility.





Proposition 2-SJR 64

Texas was never a British colony.


We do know that Texas is over 10,000 years old, and we know the name, Texas, means Friends. Texas has been claimed by six countries. Today we will explore the first and second countries in succession.

- Spain was the first European country to explore and document Texas. A Spanish explorer was hired by Jamacia in 1520 to find a passage between the Gulf of Mexico and Asia for trade. The explorer drew a map of the area thus formally documenting the existence of Texas as part of the Gulf Coast. Early Spanish explorers came into the region looking for overland routes to the Mississippi River and were involved in trade routes and slavery. For over 160 years the Spanish traders abandoned the land.
- French Texas: 1684-1689 The French expedition left France on July 24, 1684, to find the Mississippi River. The French bumbled their targeted journey's location due to inept map construction and the loss of a supply ship to Spain during the voyage. They instead claimed the 160-year Spanish deserted territory and built Fort Saint Louis. One ship returned to France and the remaining two were destroyed by a storm. Disease and hardship destroyed the colony leaving approximately 45 people. Their final attempt to find the Mississippi River resulted in disaster. For five years the French claimed Texas.

Medicare Open Enrollment

October 15th – December 7th **2023**



The Medicare Open Enrollment starts on October 15th and ends on December 7, 2023. This timeframe gives you an opportunity to review your plan choice and make changes, if necessary. Review your current plan and if that plan is making any changes for the coming year. The changes you can make is to switch to a different Medicare plan like Medicare Advantage Plan (Part C) or drop your Medicare Advantage plan and go back to Traditional Medicare (Parts A & B). Medicare has added more accepted care. You can look at Supplemental Insurance that may cover the remaining 20% that Traditional Medicare does not – they cover 80%. Now, if your Veteran spouse served 20 years or more – after the age of 65 you are covered with Tricare For Life....Best coverage – Medicare (Primary) Tricare For Life (Secondary) – you do NOT need an additional medical insurance policy. (If divorced from a Veteran not eligible).

WHAT ARE THE CHANGES FOR MEDICARE PART B IN 2023? – The standard monthly premium for Medicare Part B enrollees will be \$164.90 for 2023, a decrease of \$5.20 from \$170.10 in 2022. The annual deductible for all Medicare Part B beneficiaries is \$226 in 2023, a decrease of \$7.00 from the annual deductible of \$233.00 in 2022.

CAN YOU SWITCH TO MEDICARE ADVANTAGE DURING THE OPEN

ENROLLMENT? If you are in Traditional Medicare, you can switch Part D plan or switch to a Medicare Advantage Plan during the Medical Open Enrollment period that runs from October 15-7 December 2023. One CANNOT use the Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment period(from 1 January to 31 March) unless you are enrolled in Medicare.

WILL MEDICARE PART D PREMIUMS INCREASE IN 2023? With a premium stabilization-capped 2024 base beneficiary premium of \$34.70, the average basic Part D premium is projected to increase from \$34.09 in 2023 to \$34.50in 2024, a 7.5% increase.

IS MEDICARE AGE CHANGING TO 67? The progressive changes are nearing their conclusion: Beginning in 2022, the standard age for full benefits will be 67 for anyone born after 1960. Besides the Medicare eligibility age of 65, what remains unchanged is that you can opt to begin drawing partial Social Security benefit as early as 62.

Associate Membership \$25.00


Associate membership is for women who are active members of another Republican club affiliated with the TFRW or men associated with the Republican Party.
