Chara McMichael Biography

Chara McMichael serves as Executive Director of the Human Trafficking Interdiction Division (HTI) within BCFS Health and Human Services. Under Chara's leadership, HTI provides relational advocacy services, operates a 24/7/365 hotline, runs care coordination services, leads a task force with law enforcement partners, and recruits local community members to expand a survivor's village.

After more than 30 years in the political realm, with leadership positions in political advocacy groups, the Texas State House, United States Congress and the Embassy of Israel, Chara possesses a wealth of knowledge in policy formation, agency rule-making authority, regulations, and inter-governmental relations. She also served in an international non-profit as the Director of Government Relations and Grants, adding non-profit and government grant writing capabilities.

Passionate about the fight against human trafficking, Chara's involvement extends back over two decades with key highlights including spearheading passage of landmark anti-human trafficking legislation in Texas, leading to the creation of the first statewide human trafficking prevention task force, significant reforms to better facilitate investigation and prosecutions, enhanced protections for minor victims, and increased penalties for predators.

Chara has a Bachelor of Science from Southwest Texas State University and an International Master of Business Administration from Texas State. She is delighted to be home in "God's Country," and actively engaged with a team driven to help turn victims into survivors and thrivers.



Mexican Republic Independence from Spain





Did You Know? Spain Reclaimed Texas from the French but slavery caused the next transition to the Republic of Texas.


Believe it or not Spain reclaimed Texas from France in 1690 and retained ownership until 1821. In 1821, Mexico won the conflict with Spain. Texas at that point became a part of Mexico. Mexico became the third country to claim ownership of our illustrious Texas.

After the battle with Spain, Mexico acknowledged its weakness. There was a struggle to strengthen itself and the method chosen was to increase the size and strength of the newly won nation through politics. To show the new nation's ability to grow and control its holdens the decision was made to allow colonization. Mexico's political decision was to allow people from the United States to move in and colonize the area. The forgotten or not deeply discussed issue was the impact of slavery on the nation. Mexico was a slave free country.

The colonists moved into the territory expecting to continue the practice of slavery as they had in the states. The newcomers changed the name for Texas to Mexican Texas. Texas was now divided in its citizenry. However, Slavery was officially abolished in Mexico in 1829 leaving the colonist with little choice. Either they freed their slaves, or they would fight for independence. The colonists fought for independence and within six months, October 1835 – April 1836 the new country was founded and called the Republic of Texas.

The new Republic of Texas developed and adopted a new constitution. The new constitution endorsed the practice of slavery. Reestablishing the law prohibited in Mexico. At this point Texas has been owned by four different countries. Next month we will discuss the remaining two countries.
