

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN PALLIATIVE AND HOSPICE CARE



WHAT IS PALLIATIVE CARE? Palliative Care is the care of patients with a terminal or life limiting diagnosis. It focuses on providing relief from the associated symptoms such as: pain, physical and/or mental stress. The goal is to provide quality of life for both the patient and family.

SUMMARY CRITERIA: (1) Patients that have had recurrences or worsening of symptoms within the framework of a life-limiting illness. (2) Patients with a life limiting illness that are experiencing symptom distress despite established palliative care management and protocols. (3) Patients who have consented to being referred to the services. (4) Patients that are aware of their diagnosis and their prognosis (life expectancy). (5) Patients that are in the last stages of advanced illness for which there is no possibility of cure (weeks or months). A patient may move back and forth between phases. These phases provide a clinical indication of the level of care required.


PHASES OF ILLNESS: (1) Stable: symptoms are adequately controlled by established management. (2) *Unstable: Development of a new problem or a rapid increase in the severity of the existing problems. (3) Deteriorating: Gradual worsening of existing symptoms or the development of new but expected problems. Palliative Care completely covered by Medicare; Patients can continue to seek treatments for cure; Nurses available for emergency visits 24/7.

WHAT IS HOSPICE DISEASE-SPECIFIC INDICATORS: The goal of Hospice is to allow terminally ill people to have the best quality of life possible. Hospice Disease – Specific Indicators: **CANCERS** with poor prognosis (lung, brain, breasts, prostate, pancreatic and others). **CARDIAC:** Shortness of breath with exertion, Ejection fraction 20% or less, Recurrent symptoms of heart failure, Activity intolerance, Recurrent chest pain, Poor response to Diuretics, Vasodilators or ACE inhibitors. **COPD/LUNG DISEASE:** History of frequent ER visits, respiratory failure or infections, Shortness of breath at rest, Oxygen dependent, Poor response to bronchodilators, Hypoxia on room air. **DEMENTIA/ALZHEIMER:** Non-ambulatory, Incontinent of bowel or bladder, Recent hospital visits, History of infections, ADL assistance required, Lack meaningful verbal communication, and weight loss. **LIVER DISEASE:** Easy bleeding/bruising, Recurrent episodes of confusion, Jaundice, Ascite. **NEUROLOGICAL (CVA, PARKINSONS, ALS):** Unable to ambulate along, ADL assistance required, Limited speech, Increased weakness, Incontinent to bowel or bladder & weight loss. **RENAL DISEASE:** Advanced kidney disease, Patient not seeking dialysis or transplant. **STROKE AND COMA:** Respiratory failure, Dysphagia, Weight loss of 10% in past 6 months. **TERMINAL INFECTIONS DISEASE:** AIDS, Sepsis infection, Lymphoma, unrelated or persistent despite treatment, (loss of at least 10% body mass). **HOSPICE CARE,** in general is covered 100% by Medicare & Medicaid, Private Insurance may cover all or part of your Hospice care, Hospice is also covered by Veteran's Benefit Plan. *Medical equipment related to admission diagnosis provided!

THE GOAL OF HOSPICE IS TO ALLOW TERMINALLY ILL PEOPLE TO HAVE THE BEST QUALITY OF LIFE POSSIBLE. **HOSPICE also has programs to help the family member(s) to stay positive and help them through this difficult time.

Democrats Founded the KKK

The Ku Klux Klan also known as the KKK was formed in 1869 as a military division of the Democratic Party. It was the first organized terrorist group formed in the United States. It was organized by Confederate General Nathan Bedford Forrest. The Klan used intimidation, night raids, destruction of personal property, murders, physical assaults and withholding political rights to vote. It focused its terror predominately on Black Americans, Jews, Catholics and white Republicans. Most noted is the methodology by which that Klan acts were committed: the dark of night and with disguises to hide individual identity.

General Forrest's perception of the KKK (a gentle nudge and little persuasion) didn't match that of others in the organization. The general's thoughts then turned to dissolving the organization. The KKK did not fade, however. It proved its strength as it resurfaced during the immigration of approximately 2 million Catholic Italians in the early decades of the 1900s with the Jim Crow Laws. Then there was the 1950s and 1960 when Blacks once again demanded their civil rights. The definition of whiteness entered the fray. If an individual had one drop of non-white blood, he or she was considered a person of color and was therefore considered an undesirable and not entitled to civil rights.

Immigrants were subjected to tests and value judgements to determine their level of whiteness. The 1950s-1960s also known as the civil rights movement rejuvenated the KKK habits of lynching, property damage and other means to humiliate those deemed undesirable.

The Ku Klux Klan still has not achieved its primary purpose. The primary purpose of the KKK was and is to overthrow the Republican state governments in the South.



ARE YOU ALREADY REGISTERED?

To confirm your voter registration status, visit [Am I Registered](#) application. If you moved from one place to another in the same county, you can change your information online at the [Secretary of State's Voter Registration Name/Address Change](#) website.

WAYS TO REGISTER: To register to vote in Texas, simply complete a voter registration application and return it to your county election office at least 30 days before the upcoming election date. To complete an application, you may: (1) Complete an application using the SOS ONLINE VOTER REGISTRATION APPLICATION. Simply fill in the required information, print, sign and mail directly to your county election office. (2) Request a PRINTED APPLICATION. The office will mail a voter registration application to the address provided. (3) Contact or visit your local VOTER REGISTRAR to complete registration process.

YOU ARE ELIGIBLE TO REGISTER TO VOTE

IF: (1) You are a United States citizen (2) You are a resident of the county where you submit the application (3) You are 18 years of age on Election Day! (4) You are not a convicted felon (you may be eligible to vote if you have completed your sentence, probation and parole); and (5) You have not been declared by a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be either totally mentally incapacitated or partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote.

SHOW OF (7) ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF

PHOTO ID: (1) Texas Driver License; (2) Show Texas Handgun License; (3) Texas Personal ID Card; (4) US Citizenship Certificate with Photo; (5) Texas Election ID Certificate; (6) US Military ID card with Photo; (7) US Passport – Card or Book

MILITARY & OVERSEAS VOTERS:

“Overseas” is defined as anywhere outside the U.S. (Includes Mexico/Canada). You can use the regular registration and early voting by mail process (known as “absentee” voting)

VOTERS WITH DISABILITIES: (1) Citizen and 18 years of age (3) Have not been convicted or a felony or if they have been convicted, have completed all of their punishment, parole, supervision, probation or have received a pardon (4) Have not been determined by a final judgment of a court to be totally mentally incapacitated or partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote (5) Individuals who have legal guardians may be eligible to register, depending on whether the court took away their right to vote. All guardianship orders issued after 1 September 2007 must state whether the individual can vote (6) People with disabilities can receive assistance registering to vote from any state agency that provides services to persons with disabilities or from any person they choose (7) On 1 September 1999, Texas became the first state to require all new voting systems be accessible to voters with disabilities and provide a practical and effective means for voters with disabilities to cast a secret ballot. **ALL POLLING PLACES IN TEXAS MUST BE ACCESSIBLE!**

VOTERS MAY VOTE EARLY, EITHER IN PERSON OR BY MAIL: Voters who vote during Early Voting Period may vote at any early voting site in the political subdivision that is holding the election. If a voter will be 65 years of age or older on Election Day, has a disability or will be outside the county during early voting hours and on Election Day, the voter can apply to vote by mail. Submit a completed and signed Application for a Ballot by Mail any time from the 60th to the 11th day before Election Day to the proper county early voting clerk.
